### Location and Venue

The city of Torino is located in the north-west of Italy, and is easily accessible by train and by plane from the International Airports of Milano Malpensa ([www.milanomalpensa-airport.com/en](http://www.milanomalpensa-airport.com/en)) and Torino Caselle ([www.aerportoditorino.it/en](http://www.aerportoditorino.it/en)).

The conference will take place at the main hall of the University of Torino "La Cavallerizza". The hall is located in the City Centre, close to the hotels and to the main tourist attractions ([www.turismotorino.org](http://www.turismotorino.org)).

Founded by a local tribe at the intersection of two rivers, Torino became a roman colony with the name of "Augusta taurinorum" in the first century B.C. Thereafter, twenty centuries of history left to the city a special charm and many architecturally important buildings, especially from the period in which it was the capital of the Duchy of Savoy. Torino became in 1861 the first Capital of the Italian Kingdom. Recently, the city hosted the XX<sup>th</sup> Winter Olympic Games (2006) and has been awarded European Capital of Sports (2015).
